Key drivers of youth homelessness

The Tweed Shire has a serious rental affordability and housing supply problem driven by:

- High property prices relative to income
- Low affordable rental housing supply
- High unemployment and under-employment rates (almost double the NSW state average)
- Low social housing supply (over 30% lower than the NSW state average)
